Selectmen's meeting minutes October 20th, 2009

Attendance- Bob Drew and Stephen Goldsmith. Larry Fox, and Scott Gardiner were also present.

1. We signed an agreement with Fairpoint for a business rate plan, which should save us money.
2. We accepted the minutes from last week.
3. We signed the 2009 municipal valuation.
4. Bill McCormick came regarding the lights and the CMP project at the Tennis Courts and library. We told Bill that we would honor the letter signed by two past Selectmen stating that the Town would pick up the cost in the future to replace the light pole. We will send the library a check for \$3,119.09. That will be the total amount the Town spends and the library will have all the electric put in from the new pole to the Tennis courts done under ground and they will pay for this cost.
5. We voted to meet at the library Thursday December 10th at 7:00P.M.
6. We received some information that there is another mess starting on the West Lovell Road in exactly the same location as we have dealt with in the past. We will view this.
7. We reviewed some information about Flood Plan Insurance and mitigation projects.
8. Bob sent to Buzz some Tax cards on Ladies Delight.
9. Bob has written a letter to MMA regarding a legal issue we are having. A copy is in our legal file.
10. The Eastman Hill Fund called Steve about a Grant he wrote for The Recreation Department. He is just playing telephone tag with them. It appears we will get the funding.
11. Larry went to the Dam and cleaned out some more debris. Bob also received an email from HEB about this.
12. Larry had a complaint from Mrs. Korth about his ditching of the roads.
13. Carl Bois is still trapping beaver for us.

14. The Town crew will be working on Horseshoe Pond Road. Some of it will be brought back to dirt.
15. We received some information from an attorney about a foreclosed property.
16. Larry has taken the dump trailer to the Big rig shop to have the body pins fixed.
17. We received a complaint letter from Mrs. Koop regarding the odor and barking dogs at the Molloy property. A copy is in the minutes.
18. Mark Moulton came in to discuss the fire departments plans to purchase a new combination pumper/tanker this year. The cost is estimated at \$170,000.00
